Architecture and design dominate the 5th issue of JOSHA. Dr Bajčinovci, from the University of Pristine in Kosovo, published 4 new textbooks in Albanian on architectural design principles. Industrial Complexes 1, Industrial complexes 2, Vertical Farms and Research Centres and Laboratories, each of them complemented with charts, photographs, drawings, sketches and contemporary design guidelines.

The JOSHA editorial team attended the Frankfurt Book Fair, taking part from the 11th to the 15th of October. The participation in the fair was extremely successful, it was a really interesting and important time for the whole team and gave us the opportunity to share our intentions and ideas with people from all around the world. Apart from giving our visitors information about the International Academy of Science, Humanities and Arts, our publishing software, and the aims and variety of JOSHA, we focussed on our current main mission, the Demetrios project. We established great contacts with publishers from Iran, Georgia and Colombia and managed to inspire them with the great vision of making literature, textbooks and children's books available for all visitors of the JOSHA website. All this keeps us motivated to continue working hard and moving forward with all our projects.

The JOSHA Demetrios project flyer is again present in the current issue, this time in Slovak, Italian and Latvian. We continue to pursue our goal to spread the aims of the project in as many languages as possible and expand the information worldwide, and as always more is yet to come.

In the section of Medicine, Dr Gonzales et.al., from the Universidad Industrial de Santander, Colombia, published an original article in Spanish describing urinary tract infection (UTI) as a marker of poor outcome in children with severe neutropenia following chemotherapy. From the outcomes assessed they found more clinical sepsis, need of ICU (intensive care unit) admissions, and even mortality in children that develop urinary tract infection during chemotherapy. They also describe the difficulties in diagnosing UTIs in pediatric patients with severe neutropenia and propose that the initial evaluation of this type of patient should include urinalysis and urine culture, and any sign of inflammation in the urinalysis should be considered as pathologic.

Nóra Javorniczky presents a beautiful educational cartoon in Hungarian, "I am different. Am I different?". It has been created with the goal of educating people on the integration of children with intellectual disabilities. Educational materials on this topic are still lacking for the youngest age groups to introduce the idea of intellectual disabilities, and to show them that some of their peers, even though different from what we call average, are still valuable members of the community. Books for children of the world, educational, entertaining and, if available, bilingual, will be one focus of our future work.

We at JOSHA wish all our readers a joyful reading experience.
