However, Al-amin offers solutions to standardize and monitor curricula. In the final part of his series, Al-amin calls for the integration of peace education into religious curricula and community programs to play a crucial role in mitigating religious conflicts in northern Nigeria. He emphasizes the importance of inclusive, non-biased education that respects plurality of beliefs and promotes peaceful co-existence.
