Male teachers in Brazilian Early Childhood Education face unique challenges like prejudice and distrust. In his study, Renan R. Silva explores how a psychologist's autoethnographic perspective can improve their performance. The research aims to fill knowledge gaps and promote inclusive practices for a more welcoming environment.

Congenital Pulmonary Airway Malformation (CPAM) is a rare fetal lung anomaly, classified into five types. Type 2 CPAM, with multiple small cysts, has a good prognosis if hydrops is absent. The case described by German Andres Guevara Lizarazo, Laura Juliana Posso Perea, Carlos Andrés Gómez Arias and Daniela Lopez Londoño involved a 36-year-old woman whose fetus showed regression of CPAM after corticosteroid therapy, highlighting the importance of early diagnosis and perinatal care.

Daniela Alejandra Francisco Silva's bachelor thesis explores women's medical practice in medieval Europe, examining how women from various social classes accessed knowledge and the role of medicine in society and legal trials. It discusses the acceptance and rejection of female health professionals, and the links between women, religion, culture, and medicine, providing a comprehensive view of medieval female medical practices.

Jessica Samantha Lira Da Costa's work analyses femininity and helplessness in Clarice Lispector's "A Hora da Estrela" using Freudian theory. It explores Lispector's unique literature, the construction of femininity in psychoanalysis, and the connection between helplessness, poetry, and tragedy. Both psychoanalysis and art help confront human vulnerability.

Kabuki syndrome (KS) is a rare genetic disorder caused by mutations in the KMT2D or KDM6A genes, affecting development and causing malformations. A case in Santander, Colombia described by German Andres Guevara Lizarazo, Sergio Andrés Córdoba Silvestre, Rosalia Briceño Mora and Mariana Catalina Blanco Restrepo involved a male fetus with ultrasound-detected anomalies like cleft lip, palate, heart issues, and skeletal malformations. Genetic testing confirmed a KDM6A mutation. This highlights the importance of prenatal ultrasound and genetic testing for early diagnosis, which can improve management and prognosis.
