as “Books as Open Online Content (BOOC)”**

With this issue, JOSHA is starting a new project, the **Demetrios Project**.

We chose Demetrios of Phaleron, a student of Theophrastus and most probably of Aristotle, as the name patron of our project. Demetrios was instrumental in establishing the ancient Library of Alexandria, probably the largest and most significant library of the ancient world covering all aspects of Science, Humanities and the Arts in many different languages.

It is our objective to open up JOSHA as a universally accessible, open access library to all languages and countries.

JOSHA will focus initially on publishing and providing open-access to textbooks in any field of Science, Humanities and the Arts, to students and readers worldwide. JOSHA will publish textbooks in any language after appropriate peer review by experts in the field knowledgeable of the respective language. The IASHA Board and JOSHA Editors feel that there is an urgent need to provide access to these materials especially to students and scientists in low and middle income countries, where textbooks are simply unaffordable by most students. We encourage authors and readers to submit their textbooks for publication in JOSHA free of charge and to alert us to specific areas of need.

We will start this project with the Architecture Textbook by Professor Bujar from Albania, written in the Albanian language – as you will be able to see in the next paper.

The non-profit International Academy of Science, Humanities, and Arts (IASHA e.V.) in Freiburg, the publisher of JOSHA, and all its members will make a special effort to support this project. Das *JOSHA* Demetrios Projekt: Monographien und Lehrbücher in allen Sprachen als zur kostenlosen Lektüre und zum kostenlosen Download (Books as Open Online Content “BOOC”)

Wir beginnen unsere neue *JOSHA* Ausgabe diesen Montat mit dem Demetrios Projekt.

Wir wählen „Demetrios of Phaleron“, Schüler des Theophrastus und möglicherweise von Aristoleles, zum Namenspatron unseres Projekts. Demetrios gründete die antike Bibliothek in Alexandria, die wohl die größte und bedeutenste Büchersammlung der Antike war und eine große Anzahl verschiedener Fächer und Sprachen umfasste.

Auch uns liegt es am Herzen, *JOSHA* als universal zugängliche Bibliothek allen Sprachgruppen und Ländern zu öffnen.

Wir setzen es uns daher zum Ziel, „open-access“ Lehrbücher in jeglicher Disziplin der Natur-, Geistes- und Sozialwissenschaften und Künsten, Studierenden und Lesern auf der ganzen Welt bereitzustellen. *JOSHA* wird Lehrbücher und Monographien in allen Sprachen publizieren, gegeben dass eine angemessene Begutachtung („peer review“) von ExpertInnen des betreffenden Faches vorangegangen ist. Wir, die *IASHA* Mitglieder sowie *JOSHA* Herausgeber, sind der festen Überzeugung, dass die Bereitstellung von Lehrmaterialien für Studierende und Lehrende in einkommensschachen Regionen dieser Welt, in denen diese Materialien oft nicht finanziell tragbar sind, großes Potential besitzt. Wir möchten daher *JOSHA* AutorInnen und LeserInnen dazu ermutigen, uns Textbücher und Lehrmaterialien unentgeltlich zuzusenden, um uns auf spezifische Themenfelder, die besonders großen Publikationsbedarf vorweisen, aufmerksam zu machen.

Den Auftakt des Demetrios Projekts gestalten wir mit einem Architekturlehrbuch von Professor Buar aus Albaninen, das auf albanisch publiziert wird, wie Sie im nächsten Artikel zu lesen bekommen werden.

JOSHA is published by the International Academy of Science, Humanities and Arts ([IASHA](#) e.V.) - a German non-profit association, located in Freiburg, Germany.

JOSHA is a multi-disciplinary, multi-language, non-profit open-access electronic journal, publishing advances in all fields of science, humanities, and arts, which was founded almost 3 years ago.

It currently receives approximately **400 views and 300 downloads/day**.

JOSHA is listed in Research Gate and currently indexed in [ROAD](#) (Directory of Open Access Scholarly Resources), [e-journal.org](#), and [Scilit](#).

Manuscripts for **JOSHA** will undergo editorial review and rating within 7 days. Subsequent peer-review will be completed within 14 days. Upon acceptance, your paper will receive a DOI (Digital Object Identifier) and appear in the Journal. The authors alone are responsible for the contents of their publication.

All **JOSHA** articles are made publicly accessible via the Internet without any restrictions or payment by the reader.

PDF versions are freely available for download and provide an easy way for users to print copies themselves.

As part of our copyright and license agreement, **JOSHA** articles may be reproduced without formal permission or payment of permission fees. As a courtesy, however, we suggest a donation in support of **JOSHA**'s open access publications.

Reproduction of pictures, figures or tables from any article is permitted free of charge and without formal written permission from **JOSHA** or the author, provided that the figure or table is original and that proper attribution of authorship and the correct citation details are given as acknowledgment.

Currently, publication in **JOSHA** is free of charge. Journal management cost and article processing cost (APC) are born by IASHA e.V. - a non-profit organization – based on voluntary donations.

The copyright of the submitted papers will remain with the authors. Papers in **JOSHA** may be published elsewhere in the original or revised version. **JOSHA** will also accept important articles that have been previously published elsewhere. Any issue of the copyright is the responsibility of the authors.

Authors grant JOSHA a license to publish the article. Authors also grant any third party the right to use the article freely as long as its integrity is maintained and its original authors, citation details and publisher are identified. Any third party may not use the material for commercial purposes.

The terms and conditions of publishing articles in **JOSHA** are outlined in detail under [Creative Commons Attribution License 4.0](#).

Open access content of **JOSHA** is freely available online. Through licensing their work under CC BY-NC, authors grant readers the right to unrestricted dissemination and re-use of the work.

This liberal licensing will facilitate the transfer and growth of scientific knowledge. The Open Access Scholarly Publishers Association (OASPA) recommends the use of CC BY for the open access publication of research literature, and many research funders worldwide (e.g. the European Commission's Horizon 2020 framework program, the United Nations, Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft, Max Planck Institutes, Wellcome Trust, Australian Governments and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation) endorse or mandate that research they have supported be published under CC BY.

Where an author is prevented from being the copyright holder (for instance in the case of employees of the US government, Commonwealth governments or other governments), minor variations may be required. In such cases the copyright and license statement in individual articles will be adjusted.
